


Adult Probation Quarterly Report




Adult Probation refers to individuals sentenced to a term of traditional probation. This excludes individuals sentenced to post-release supervision (PRS). Any data that includes both traditional and PRS will note as such.



Only current, active adults with a LS/CMI assessment are included by classification. Not all adults are required to have an LS/CMI assessment. PRS classified adults are excluded.



Due to the large number of actions that would prompt a administrative sanction, only a portion of those that are the most used are displayed. This represents all administrative sanctions that have been applied to all active adult probationers as of the last day of the calendar quarter.



Statewide Recidivism Rate



of adults who were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for another qualifying offense within three years of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of June 30, 2022. At this time, PRS cannot be separated within the recidivism data and are included in this percentage.

Recidivism by Risk Level

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Level of Service/ Case Management Inventory (LS/CMI), the total population of low risk adults who discharge successfully between March 31, 2017 and March 31, 2018 (Supreme Court requires 3 years from date of release) recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of medium or high risk adults.
