

## **Statewide Recidivism Rate**



of adults who were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for another qualifying offense within three years of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of December 31, 2022. At this time, PRS cannot be separated within the recidivism data and are included in this percentage.

## **Recidivism by Risk Level**

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Level of Service/ Case Management Inventory (LS/CMI), the total population of low risk adults who discharge successfully between December 31, 2018 and December 31, 2019 (Supreme Court requires 3 years from date of release) recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of medium or high risk adults.
