This reciprocal discipline action filed pursuant to Neb. Ct. R. § 3-321 is before the Court on the "Joint Statement RE: Sanction" filed September 17, 2012, in which the parties jointly move the Court to impose the same discipline as that imposed by the Attorney Grievance Commission of Maryland on November 16, 2011, in BC Docket No. 2011-328-05-3 ("Maryland case") involving respondent's acts in connection with the preparation of documents associated with a preferential transfer and a fraudulent conveyance which were the subject of an action in a bankruptcy case seeking to have the transfer avoided.

Specifically, the sanction to which the parties agree and seek approval is as follows:

1. The respondent receives a public reprimand in Nebraska.
2. The respondent limits his practice to exclude consumer bankruptcy matters for the period of 18 months imposed by



the Attorney Grievance Commission in the Maryland case commencing November 16, 2011.

3. The respondent will be allowed to represent those current client bankruptcy matters through to conclusion, but will not accept any new clients with consumer bankruptcy issues during the 18 month period.

4. The respondent will complete two courses on consumer bankruptcy law within the 18 month period.

5. The respondent shall provide the Counsel for Discipline of Nebraska with proof of his successful completion of the Diversion Agreement imposed in Maryland, Attorney Grievance Commission, BC Docket No. 2011-202-05-3, involving improprieties regarding record keeping and withdrawing from representation.

6. The respondent shall pay the costs of this action.

Upon due consideration the Court approves and imposes reciprocal discipline as specified above, and hereby publicly reprimands respondent and enters this ORDER OF PUBLIC REPRIMAND.
