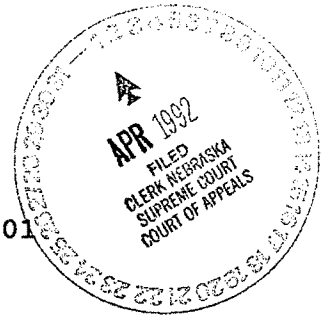

ORDER



On April 1, 1992, this matter comes on to be heard upon the record, including the Report and Recommendations of the Nebraska Commission on Judicial Qualifications, filed on March 10, 1992, and upon consideration of the Consent filed by the respondent Coady and the Response of the Prosecutor, stating the Prosecutor does not object to a court order conforming to the Commission's Report and respondent's Consent, both filed on March 27, 1992, and the court being fully advised in reference thereto finds:


1. That the respondent Judge Orville L. Coady should be and he is hereby suspended from the performance of any judicial duties without pay for one month;
2. That the respondent shall enroll in and successfully complete a course or seminar on sensitivity to racial and cultural bias approved by the Nebraska Commission on Judicial Qualifications;
3. That the Human Relations Workshop, Education 560, offered by Doane College at Crete, Nebraska, is a course on sensitivity to racial and cultural bias which has been approved by the Nebraska Commission on Judicial Qualification; and
4. That the period of suspension from the performance of judicial duties by the respondent Judge Orville L. Coady shall commence at the close of business on April 1, 1992, and continue until May 2, 1992.

5. That upon proof being filed in the office of the Clerk of this Court that the respondent Judge Orville L. Coady performed no judicial duties from April 2, 1992, through May 1, 1992, and has completed satisfactorily a course or seminar on sensitivity to racial and cultural bias which has been approved by the Nebraska Commission on Judicial Qualifications the suspension imposed by the order shall terminate.
6. That the Clerk shall forthwith deliver a copy of this order to the respondent, Judge Orville L. Coady, to his counsel, and to the Court Administrator.
