On December 11, 2020, the Court entered General Order MS20-110 which canceled the jury panels for the months of January and February 2021. The Court entered this Order due to the Court's inability to safely call and retain an adequate cross-section of jurors, and the effect of following the rapidly evolving public health recommendations on the availability of parties, counsel, citizens accused, law enforcement officers, and court staff. Consequently, the backlog of criminal and civil cases requesting jury trials has increased. In consideration of the constitutional and statutory right to a speedy trial enjoyed by citizens accused in criminal cases, and due to the ongoing restrictions created by the coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic, the Fourth Judicial District will reinstate the May 2021 Jury Panel solely for criminal cases only.

The Douglas County Annex Building renovation is completed. Accordingly, the voir dire in the below-listed criminal cases will take place in the Douglas County Annex Building located at 1805 Harney Street, Omaha, Nebraska 68102 across the street from the Douglas County Courthouse. The jury trials will be limited to the following District Court Judges on their assigned specific dates. The jury trials will be limited to the following criminal cases that have been scheduled.

All civil cases previously scheduled for jury trial are continued for good cause to alleviate the backlog associated with the citizens accused who await to assert their constitutional and statutory right to trial by jury in criminal cases.

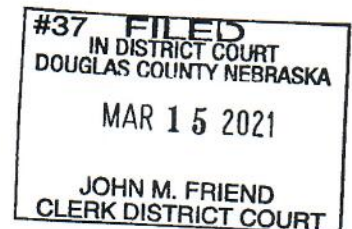

Jury summonses for the May 2021 jury panel have been mailed.

Douglas County District Courts have taken measures to mitigate the effects of this public health emergency upon our Courts and its participants. The Court finds that having any additional trials during the month of May would be impossible due to the ongoing social distancing restrictions for the public. Based on the guidelines of local health officials "a minimum distance of six (6) feet between" all persons is recommended. The Douglas County Courthouse and Courtrooms do not have the space available to accommodate any additional jury trials while at the same time maintaining social distancing restrictions. The Court recognizes that the guidelines recommended by the local health officials are not legally binding on the Court, but the Court, nonetheless, finds that adherence to these recommendations is in the best interest of the public for their health and safety.

Due to the restrictions caused by the pandemic, the Court finds that all other civil cases scheduled for the May, 2021 jury panel are continued for good cause to the next available trial date for the individual court.
