ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE PRESIDING JUDGE OF DOUGLAS COUNTY,

EFFECTIVE MARCH 17, 2020

IN RE: TRANSPORT OF PERSONS FROM DOUGLAS COUNTY CORRECTIONS OR
DOUGLAS COUNTY YOUTH CENTER

In conjunction with the Administrative Order of the Chief Justice of the Nebraska Supreme Court issued on March 12, 2020, and attached hereto:

all transportation of Defendants from Douglas County Corrections (hereinafter DCC) or Douglas County Youth Center (hereinafter DCYC) shall be suspended as specifically set forth herein. This Order shall become effective for all matters on March 17, 2020 until further order of the court.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1) Any Defendant who has been quarantined in DCC OR DCYC by order of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention or other foreign or domestic public health official shall not be allowed to appear in court without prior permission of the court;
- 2) Any Defendant who requests a continuance, bond review, motion to suppress or any other motion shall be excused from appearing personally before the court if in the custody of DCC or DCYC. Any paperwork requiring Defendant's signature will be processed by the Douglas County Sheriff;
- 3) Any Defendant scheduled for a motion to suppress evidentiary hearing, a trial, a preliminary hearing, or any other scheduled evidentiary hearing shall be transported from DCC or DCYC unless such person has been quarantined; unless other arrangements can be made by phone, skype, google chat, or by other agreements of the parties.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

All requests for transport shall be made by the attorney. No Defendant will be transported unless requested by the attorney.
