THE COURT FINDS that good cause exists to suspend the execution of warrants during the period from **March 27, 2020 to and including June 30, 2020** on individuals who have failed to pay their fines or costs. In keeping with this Order, in the event law enforcement during the period from **March 27, 2020 to and including June 30, 2020** makes contact with an individual who has a warrant for failing to pay his or her fines or costs, said individual should be released on that warrant and the warrant should remain pending.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Court, on its own motion, that the execution of warrants **between the dates of March 27, 2020 and June 30, 2020** on individuals who have failed to pay their fines or costs should be, and hereby is, suspended. In the event law enforcement makes contact with an individual between the dates of **March 27, 2020 and June 30, 2020** who has failed to pay his or her fines or costs, said individual is ordered to be released on that warrant.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that nothing in this Order shall require law enforcement to release an individual whose warrant is suspended as provided herein or who would otherwise be released on said warrant if the individual has additional warrants pending. In such event, said individual may be detained and shall be required to resolve each such warrant, including that suspended by this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that any warrant suspended by reason of this Order shall be considered not to have been delivered into the hands of any sheriff or officer to be executed and such sheriff or officer shall be relieved of his or her duty to serve the same.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
