

Answer	The current software has a very low failure rate.
Pg. 1 Sec. 1	Where are the failures most prevalent? Software, Mixers, or PCs?
Answer	Mixers, as the hardware itself needs to be periodically replaced. PC operating systems updates can sometimes cause issues with drivers. State networking can also cause a problem when trying to pull data in from the case management system.
Pg. 1 Sec. 1	What does the AOC want to add to its existing digital recording solution?
Answer	See RFP section 3 'Additional Features' starting on page 7.

Answer	The only copy of audio retained is on a single compact disc stored locally at the courthouse. The AOC is evaluating options and costs for centralized long-term server storage with backups. This is one of the reasons file storage was included in the 'Additional Features' section of the RFP.



Sec. E Software	This section states the AOC holds 140 licenses. Does this equate to 140 courtrooms/portable systems?
Answer	Yes
Sec. E Software	Will the AOC consider responses that require full or partial replacements of BIS digital mixing devices?
Answer	Yes, but only those responses that are revenue neutral; there is no cost associated with the full or partial replacements of the mixers.
Sec. E Software	Does the AOC wish to integrate teleconferencing/video conferencing equipment with digital recording?
Answer	It is not a need at this time, but this option would be considered.
Sec. E Software	Can the AOC provide codec equipment details?
Answer	The AOC could provide some information, but most of the codec equipment that is in place in the courthouses was purchased and installed by the county.
Sec. E Software	Does the AOC require implementation assistance?
Answer	The AOC would require that the vendor provide information and training on any new systems to the IT department, and then statewide implementation would be managed internally
Sec. E Software	Can the AOC provide an average of recording hours per week across the state excluding District court?
Answer	This will vary widely from court to court. Some courts only have hearings once a month, for less than an hour. Some courts will consistently be holding hearings in a single courtroom back-to-back for up to half a day.
Sec. E Software	How many microphones per room are used?
Answer	This will vary from court to court as well. There are a minimum of 4 microphones in each courtroom, but some have up to 8 microphones.

Not stated	The current retention period is 3 years. How often are these records purged (does Liberty provide this housekeeping function)?
Answer	Section C subsection ii (Trial Courts) of the RFP states that "The retention period for these files varies by the type of hearing, from 30 days to permanent retention." It is only appellate courts retention period that is 3 years. The records can be purged by the courts, the AOC does not keep track of how often the local courts are performing this process. There is no automated process for purging audio records.

Not stated	Does the court have expectations regarding changes to existing schedules (longer than 3 years)?
Answer	The AOC does not expect any changes to existing retention schedules. See above for Trial Court records' retention period.
Not stated	Are vendors tasked with pushing data to the CMS or will that responsibility be left to the courts?
Answer	There is no anticipated need to push data to the CMS at this time.
Not stated	Do you want integration to the CMS where you control the recording software or do you simply want to pull data from the CMS to populate the recording header?
