Nebraska Data on Victim Youth Conferencing

Target outcome 1: 95% of VYCs will result in a reparations agreement.

•Of 871 case referrals, 677 held a VYC. Of those 677 VYCs, 668 had a reparation plan (99.6%).

Target outcome 2: 95% of reparations agreements will be fulfilled.

•Of the 668 with a reparation plan, (88.8%) successfully fulfilled (546 of 668) or a least more than half (47 of 668) of the plan. <1% of youth did not follow through (9 of 668) and <1% of youth were unreachable (1 of 668). Data was missing for 74 of 668 cases.

Target Outcome 3: 97% of participants (e.g., youth, their parents, those harmed and surrogates) will report satisfaction with VYC.

•91.1% of participants who completed a post-VYC conference survey reported being extremely satisfied (299 of 651) or satisfied (294 of 651) with VYC. 93.2% (607 of 651) said they would recommend VYC for others.

Target outcome 4: 82% of youth will not recidivate within 1 year of program participation

•87% of youth participants did not recidivate within 1-year of participating in the VYC program.






Statewide Chronic Absence Data

A Tiered Approach to Addressing Chronic Absenteeism



Multi-tiered Approach

Tier 1

- Clear, concise & consistent communication
- Routines, rituals & celebrations
- Personalized + communication
- Impact of attendance on whole child
- Connection to caring adult at school

Tier 2

- Common community & school barriers identified & addressed*
- Individualized student success plan*
- Family visits*
- Staff & peer mentors*
- Restorative alternatives
 - *Can be addressed during a restorative conference


Tier 3

- Educational support champions / advocates
- Interagency case mgt
- Individualized learning & success plan
- Legal intervention (last resort)








Nebraska Data on Excessive Absenteeism & Truancy Cases

Chronic Absenteeism Conferencing Process

School makes a referral based on benchmark. Center confirms receipt and gathers add'l info, if needed.

Center contacts individual participants to inform about process and participation.

Center schedules
prep meeting with
each participant
so they know what
to expect and to
assess for
appropriateness.

Conference is held
to explore the root
cause(s) for
absences and what
support is needed
to promote
success.


A plan is

may include
