


Average Supervision Cost (FY19)

\$24.43 / day

Maintain detention for only those youth who pose a significant risk to the community or risk to flee the jurisdiction of the court.



of youth that were discharged in the last 3 months reduced their risk in the education and employment domain. The discharged youth were initially placed on probation with a high YLS/CMI score for education and employment and have reduced their risk related to those key areas by the end of the probation term.

An increase in status youth who are diverted from the juvenile justice system or who receive a decreased term of probation supervision.



Status youth spend 31% less time on probation than delinquent youth.





Statewide Recidivism Rate



of youth that were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for a subsequent qualifying adjudication within one year of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of March 31, 2020.

Recidivism by Risk Level

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Youth Level of Risk/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI), the total population of low risk youth who discharged successfully in calendar year 2018 recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of moderate or high risk youth.
