## Nebraska Judicial Branch

- WHEREAS, *Officers, staff, and administration exemplify probation practices at its very core, accomplishing constructive change and community safety through rehabilitation, collaboration, and partnerships; and*
- WHEREAS, *Probation officers are responsible for performing juvenile intake, conducting investigations critical to court decision-making, and supervising adults and juveniles in the community; and*
- WHEREAS, *Probation officers are highly trained professionals who provide re-offense risk-reducing services and manage treatment referrals for probationers and youth; and*
- WHEREAS, *Probation officers work in partnership with community agencies, groups and providers; and*
- WHEREAS, *Probation officers promote prevention, intervention, and advocacy on behalf of probationers; and*
- WHEREAS, *Probation officers provide services, support, and protection for victims; and*
- WHEREAS, *Probation officers advocate for community and restorative justice; and*
- WHEREAS, *July 17-23, 2022, is nationally recognized as Pretrial, Probation, and Parole Supervision Week,*
