Service Interpretive Guidelines Sex Offense-Specific Evalution

SERVICE DEFINITION:

A Sex Offense-Specific Evaluation is a clinical, strengths-based evaluation of an individual who has engaged in illegal and/or sexually-abusive behaviors and who has been charged with and/or convicted of a sexual offense.

The Sex Offense-Specific Evaluation is a process of gathering information to assess client functioning and needs based on identification of the presenting problem, evaluation of mental status, formulation of a diagnostic impression (as applicable) and recommendation for treatment services/strategies. The Sex Offense-Specific Evaluation will include a mental health diagnostic impression (as applicable), history of mental health symptoms, sexual history and current sexual behavior, trauma history/symptoms, criminogenic risk, risk of harm to self and/or others (including risk for sexual re-offense), the individual's perception of the situation and collateral information. Based on the evaluation, recommendations are provided and justified for appropriate behavioral health services and treatment. The Sex Offense-Specific Evaluation may include psychological testing, if indicated.

EXPECTATIONS / REQUIREMENTS:

- The probation/problem-solving court staff member is responsible for reviewing all screenings/risk assessments to determine if the client has a need for further evaluation.
- The probation/problem-solving court staff member shall work with the client to determine a Registered Service Provider (RSP) to conduct the evaluation.
- The probation/problem-solving court staff member will communicate with the RSP to provide all collateral information to assist with the completion of the evaluation
 - 1. All evaluations should lead to clinical recommendations for a treatment services, including justification for the level of care. Evaluations could also recommend no treatment with appropriate justification.
 - 2. Evaluations should not focus on non-treatment needs and should not identify or refer to particular agencies offering the recommended service.
- This service will assist clients who have risks and needs related to problematic sexual behavior.
 The outcome of this evaluation is identifying any behavioral health diagnoses and treatment recommendations.
- Probation/problem-solving court staff members will utilize the RSP's clinical recommendations to assist in developing an individualized case management plan.
