## **NEBRASKA JUVENILE COURTS: EDUCATION COURT REPORT**

Instructions: The Nebraska Supreme Court's Commission on Children and Families in the Courts – Education Sub-Committee has developed the Nebraska Juvenile Courts: Education Court Report to assist judges in ensuring the academic needs of court-involved children and youth are addressed as well as the developmental needs of infants and toddlers. The Education Court Report contains a series of questions designed to provide the judge with pertinent information about the child's education and development. The extent to which all or only a portion of those questions are explored will vary based on the child's age and specific circumstances. Use of the Education Court Report promotes the expectation that child welfare and juvenile justice professionals have ongoing communication with the child's school, preschool or child care provider and are prepared to report relevant information to the Court. Once completed, the Education Court Report may contain information that is confidential under state and federal law and should not be released to uninvolved third parties without the Court's permission.
