The Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act is a federal law that allows people with disabilities to open tax-exempt savings accounts to save for disability-related expenses without impacting eligibility for resource-based benefits. In Nebraska, ABLE accounts are referred to as the Enable Savings Plan. An Enable account is a way for people with disabilities to save (cash, savings, etc.) in their name in a qualified ABLE account.

In Nebraska, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) is an expansion of Medicaid as health care coverage for qualified children who are without other health insurance and who do not qualify for Medicaid. CHIP provides the same services covered under Medicaid.

In order to qualify for this benefit program, persons must be a resident of Nebraska, under 19 years of age or be a primary care giver with a child under the age of 19, not covered by health insurance (including Medicaid), and a U.S. national, citizen, legal alien, or permanent resident. The person must also have an annual household income (before taxes) that is below the prescribed amounts.
