IN CASEYOU MISSED IT: Rules and Forms Changes (effective April 1, 2020)

The rules and forms associated with guardianship and conservatorship cases changed on April 1, 2020. As you know, one of the responsibilities of a guardian and/or conservator is to file an annual report. The courts require the filing of certain information and supporting documentation, to ensure that the affairs of the ward or protected person are handled properly.

Preparing for Winter Heating Assistance

Winter is coming sooner than we think! Is your ward entitled to energy assistance to assist with offsetting the cost of the heating bill? The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a federal grant administered by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. LIHEAP provides heating assistance from October I – March 31 each year for eligible persons.
