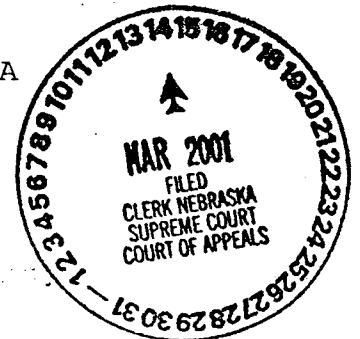

ORDER OF  
TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

On February 7, 2001, an Application for Temporary Suspension was filed by the Chair of the District Two Committee on Inquiry of the Nebraska State Bar Association, requesting that respondent be suspended from the practice of law in the State of Nebraska. On February 14, this court entered an order for respondent, within 14 days of the service upon her of said order, to show cause why her license to practice law in this state should not be suspended. Service by certified mail of the Order to Show Cause was accomplished on February 17. Respondent did not respond.


CAUSE HAVING NOT BEEN SHOWN, IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that respondent is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Nebraska until further order of this court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall forthwith comply with Neb. Ct. R. of Discipline 16 (rev. 2001), and upon failure to do so, she shall be subject to punishment for contempt of this court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Nebraska Supreme Court shall cause a copy of this Order of Temporary Suspension to be served upon respondent by certified United States mail.
