On February 27, 2002, the Iowa Supreme Court ordered that Wesley B. Huisinga be publicly reprimanded and serve 40 hours of public service. On March 4, a motion for Reciprocal Discipline was filed by the Office of the Counsel for Discipline of the Nebraska Supreme Court. On March 13, this court ordered Huisinga to show cause why this court should not enter an order of identical discipline, or greater or lesser discipline, including possible disbarment. Huisinga filed his response on March 28, 2002.

Cause having not been shown,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Huisinga be publicly reprimanded and that within thirty days of this ruling, Huisinga shall submit to this court a plan for completion of forty hours of public service to his community. The public service directed herein shall not be in addition to the 40 hours of public service ordered by the Iowa Supreme Court.


Assuming approval of the plan, Huisinga shall fulfill its requirements within one year and thereafter immediately report its completion to this court. Failure to abide by this requirement may subject Huisinga to further action by this court, including but not limited to citation for contempt.

The costs of this action are assessed against the respondent.

The Clerk of the Nebraska Supreme Court is directed to cause a copy of this order to be served upon Huisinga by certified United States mail.
