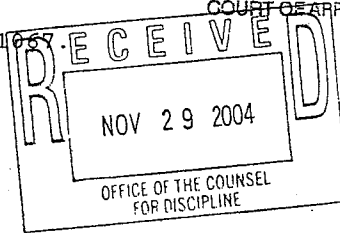

On September 20, 2004, pursuant to an Application for Temporary Suspension made by the Chair of the District Four Committee on Inquiry, Wendell E. Meissner, Respondent, was ordered to show cause why this Court should not enter an order temporarily suspending his license to practice law in this state. The Show Cause Order provides that Respondent shall respond within 7 days of receipt of the order. Respondent received the order and on November 10, 2004, filed a Receipt and Voluntary Appearance. Respondent filed a Response to the Order to Show Cause on Friday, November 19, 2004. Upon due consideration, this court finds that Respondent has not shown cause why he should not be temporarily suspended from the practice of law until further order of this court.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that pursuant to Neb. Ct. R. of Discipline 12, Wendell E. Meissner is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Nebraska until further order of this court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Wendell E. Meissner shall forthwith comply with Rule 16 of the disciplinary rules of this court, and upon his failure to do so, he shall be subject to punishment for contempt of this court.

The Clerk of the Nebraska Supreme Court is directed to cause a copy of this order to be served on Wendell E. Meissner by certified United States mail.
