On March 10, 2004, pursuant to an Application for Temporary Suspension made by the Chair of the District Two Committee on Inquiry, Victor F. Terry, Respondent, was ordered to show cause why this Court should not enter an order temporarily suspending his license to practice law in this state. Respondent has filed a response resisting the entry of an order temporarily suspending his license to practice law in the State of Nebraska.

Upon due consideration of the response, this court finds that Respondent has not shown cause why he should not be temporarily suspended from the practice of law until further order of this court.


