

Case Progression and Court Improvement Data 2008




District 8 Team 1 – Brown, Keya Paha, Cherry, Blaine, & Rock Counties

Information provided in this document is designed to help your team improve case progression, as this is one area the courts can control. Timeliness of hearings has a significant impact on time to case closure, which means that courts can make a difference in the lives of children in the system. Data on page 1 comes from Fostering Court Improvement (fosteringcourtimprovement.org/ne) and data on pages 2-4 was collected through JUSTICE to track case progression timelines for all abuse/neglect cases that closed in 2008.



Percentages for 2008 Fiscal Year






This rate (80%) is slightly higher than rates in 2006, where 75% were reunified within 12 months.










Adjudication to disposition

Best practice recommendations

Removal to first hearing – 3 days

0% of 2008 District 8 cases held the first hearing within 3 days of removal

Removal to adjudication – 60 days

60% of 2008 District 8 cases adjudicated within 60 days.




Percentages for time in months from removal to TPR

In other words, 22% of TPRs happen within 12 months statewide, compared to 100% for this team.

While case progression to TPR is quick for this team, progression to adoption is slower than for the state.

Analysis of the case progression data for all Nebraska judges shows that judges who have more timely adjudications of their cases are also able to close their cases in a more timely fashion. Specifically, those judges who have a median time to adjudications in less than 30 days from removal, have a median time to case closure of 15.5 months. Those judges who have a median time to adjudication of 31-60 days, have a median time to case closure of 17.2 months. Judges with a median time to adjudication of 61-90 days have a median time to case closure of 18.4 months. Finally, judges who have a median time to adjudication of 91 or more days have a median time to case closure of 34.3 months.
