The Nebraska Eviction Proceedings Bi-Annual Data Report

Reporting time frame of note: Jan 1, 2024 and Jun 30, 2024

This report meets the requirements of Nebraska Statute § 24-232 (2021). This report is compiled by the Research and Data team in the Operations Division of the Administrative Office of the Courts and Probation (AOCP). The report contains statistics on the number of eviction proceedings initiated during the reporting time frame, the number of tenants represented by counsel, landlords represented by counsel, number of order granting restitution of the premises entered by default, the number of orders granting restitution of the premises entered. Data included has been entered into the JUSTICE case management system by clerks based on the judge's interpretation of the statute. Data included has been validated and includes all data described below. An overview of what is included can be found at the start of each section.

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Addendum to Nebraska Eviction Proceedings Bi-Annual Data Report In accordance with Nebraska Statute§ 24-232

After publishing the Nebraska Eviction Proceedings Bi-Annual Data Report, the Administrative Office of the Courts and Probation received a question concerning a potential change in practice within Lancaster County and granting restitution of premises by a default judgment. Upon thorough examination, we can confirm that no changes have been made to Lancaster county's established practice. However, it was identified that that a newly onboarded staff had misunderstood established practice and improperly entered data.

This issue has now been fully resolved; comprehensive training has been provided to the new staff to ensure accurate data entry moving forward. Please note that this version will include a few more cases in other counties due to late entry into our JUSTICE system. We appreciate the opportunity to clarify this matter and are committed to maintaining accuracy in all our processes.
