



The discharged youth were initially placed on probation with a high YLS/CMI score for education and employment and have reduced their risk related to those key areas by the end of the probation term.



An increase in status youth who are diverted from the juvenile justice system or who receive a decreased term of probation supervision.

Status youth spend 41% less time on probation than delinquent youth.




of youth are supervised while at home. The remaining 27% are supervised in out-of-home placements, on Mar 31, 2025.

## Statewide Recidivism Rate



### **Recidivism by Risk Level**

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Youth Level of Risk/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI), the total population of low risk youth who discharged successfully between Mar 31, 2023 and Mar 31, 2024 recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of moderate or high risk youth.
