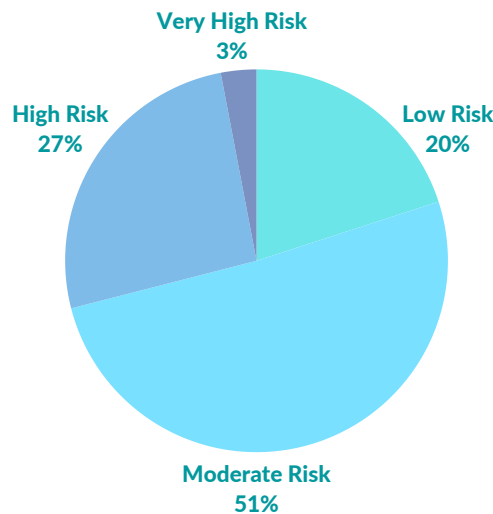

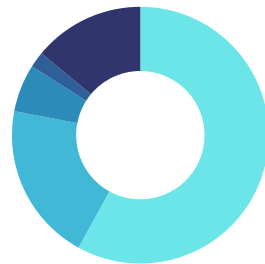

Maintain detention for only those youth who pose a significant risk to the community or risk to flee the jurisdiction of the court.

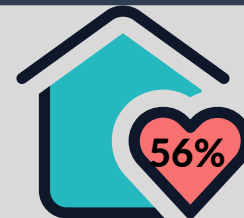
Detention Screenings Conducted

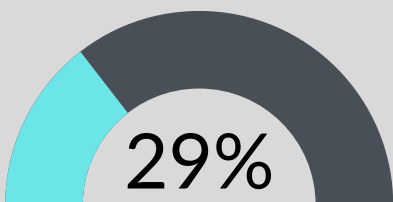

The discharged youth were initially placed on probation with a high YLS/CMI score for education and employment and have reduced their risk related to those key areas by the end of the probation term.

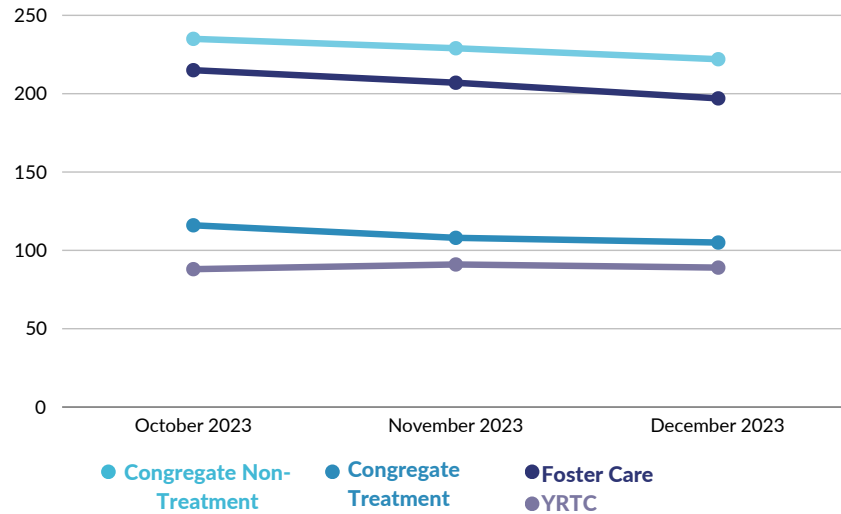

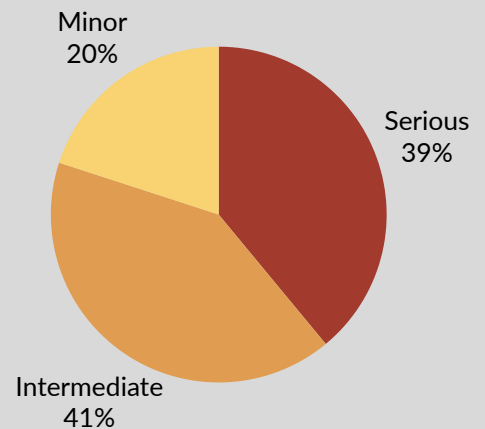

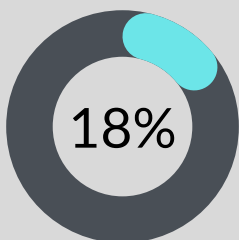
50%

### Statewide Recidivism Rate



of youth that were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for a subsequent qualifying adjudication within one year of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of Dec 31, 2023.

### Recidivism by Risk Level

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Youth Level of Risk/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI), the total population of low risk youth who discharged successfully between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022 recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of moderate or high risk youth.
