

On June 23, 2021, the Nebraska Supreme Court adopted Neb. Ct. R. § 6-1473 and rule amendments to Neb. Ct. R. § 6-1507, which both relate to the registration of foreign judgments and will have a delayed effective date of August 28, 2021:

CHAPTER 6: TRIAL COURTS

....

Article 14: Uniform County Court Rules of Practice and Procedure.

....

§ 6-1473. Registration of foreign judgments; registration of Canadian judgments.

(A) Registration of foreign judgments from other United States jurisdictions. Upon the filing of a foreign judgment and affidavit as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-1587.04, the clerk shall, within 10 days of such filing, mail notice of the filing of the foreign judgment to the judgment debtor at the address provided within the affidavit.

(B) Registration of Canadian money judgments. Upon receipt of a registration that includes the required documents and information as set forth in statute, and payment of the fee as for registration of a foreign judgment under § 25-1587.06, the clerk shall file the registration, assign a docket number, and enter the Canadian judgment in the court's docket.

Article 15: Uniform District Court Rules of Practice and Procedure.

....

§ 6-1507. Registration of foreign judgments; registration of Canadian judgments.

(A) Registration of foreign judgments from other United States jurisdictions. Upon the filing of a foreign judgment and affidavit as required by ~~statute~~ Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-1587.04, the clerk ~~of the district court~~ shall, within 10 days of such filing, mail notice of the filing of the foreign judgment to the judgment debtor at the address provided within the affidavit.

(B) Registration of Canadian money judgments.
