Nebraska Court Improvement Project

What is CIP?

The Nebraska Court Improvement Project (CIP) is a federally funded department under the direction of the Nebraska Administrative Offices of Court and Probation. CIP facilitates a multi-disciplinary network of judgeled teams across the state known as "Through the Eyes of the Child" initiative. Members of these teams collaborate at the local level to improve issues in the juvenile court system. The teams are guided by the Resource Guidelines published by the National Council on Juvenile and Family Court Judges (NCJFCJ), which sets out best practice standards for the juvenile court processes.

Each team selects its own projects and goals based on the needs of its community and court system. <u>The Court</u> <u>Improvement Project staff</u>, under the guidance of Project Chair, Judge Larry Gendler, provides technical assistance to the local groups, <u>data collection and reporting</u>, develop resources for the local teams, and work on a statewide basis to address concerns within the juvenile court system. The Initiative also holds <u>events</u>, such as annual regional conferences, lecture series, webinars and trainings open to the public, court staff training, and a statewide Children's Summit every three years.
