Program	Description	To Initiate / Funding
<b>Pre-hearing Conference</b> (PHC) - Initial Removal	At initial protective custody hearing, a brief (30-45 minutes) day-of-court, facilitated conference is used to address key preliminary safety and permanency issues with parents, DHHS, attorneys, GALs, and sometimes CASA.	Court Ordered / ODR (Office of Dispute Resolution)
Pre-hearing Conference Permanency Review Conference (PHPR)	Optimally scheduled <b>60 days prior to a 12-month permanency review</b> hearing, this facilitated conference requires parents, DHHS, attorneys, and GALs to address critical progress for reunification or other permanency decisions, and develop action steps for the future of the children.	Court Ordered / ODR
Pre-hearing Termination of Parental Rights Conference (PHTPR)	Scheduled <b>once a motion has been filed</b> , this facilitated conference requires parents, foster/adoptive parents, and professionals to address critical permanency issues for the child/ren and determine next steps, including the considerations of relinquishment or a contested trial.	Court Ordered / ODR
Family Group Conference (CW - FGC) - any stage	A research-based, family-centered approach that <b>may be used at any stage</b> of the child welfare process. Center staff with specialized training engage with immediate and extended family members and other support persons, as well as the network of professionals to prepare for the FGC. During the FGC, the team creates a plan for permanency and addresses issues related to safety, welfare and well-being of the child/ren. Private family time is utilized as an essential component of the process.	Court Ordered -or- Motion by Court-related Stakeholder / ODR
<b>Child Welfare Mediation</b> (CWM) - any stage	A small mediation between two parties to work on solving problems that are a barrier to the child/ren's and family's progress in the case (e.g., parent and foster parent, parent and a professional, etc.)	Court Ordered -or- Motion by Court-related Stakeholder / ODR
<b>Child Welfare Facilitation</b> (CWF) - any stage	A flexible multi-party facilitated meeting with parents and key stakeholders to unravel conflicts and set a better course direction for the child, parents, and caregivers. This process can be beneficial at different times through the course of the child welfare case, especially when the issues do not rise to the level of needing a Family Group Conference.	Court Ordered -or- Motion by Court-related Stakeholder / ODR

#### **Family Mediation**

Parenting Plan	Trained mediators work with both parents to assist them in developing a parenting plan that meet the best interests of the child/ren.	- Client paid - sliding fee scale - Juv. Court Bridge Order / ODR
Special Education	Specially trained mediators assist parents and school personnel to resolve disagreements, including issues regarding identification, evaluation, and educational placement.	Parent Complaint -or- School Referral / Nebraska Department of Education
