Misc Submission to Court - Jurisdiction

This matter is before us for purposes of jurisdictional review. The district court entered an ex parte restraining order on January 13, 2022, but following a hearing on February 9, the court found insufficient evidence to issue a temporary restraining order and dismissed Appellant's complaint. The general rule is that the denial of a temporary restraining order is not a final and appealable order. See e.g. *Smith v. City of Papillion*, 270 Neb. 607, 705 N.W.2d 584 (2005). The parties are hereby directed to include in their briefs a discussion of whether this court has jurisdiction to address the appeal from the district court's February 9, 2022, order.
