Custer Co. Judicial Center ceremony break ground set for Tues., May 27th

Broken Bow, Ne. — The Custer Campus Board of Directors and Custer Economic Development Corporation (CEDC) will officially break ground on the site of the seven acre Custer Campus in Broken Bow on Tuesday, May 27, at 1:30 p.m. According to officials, Governor Heineman, Chief Justice Heavican, Retired Court Administrator Janice Walker, Custer County

Board of Supervisors, Custer Campus Board of Directors, and CEDC Board of Directors are expected to participate in the ceremonies. The general public is encouraged and welcome to attend.

The new Custer County Judicial Center will include two courtrooms for County and District court, a hearing room, offices for the County Attorney, Probation Officer, clerks of the

court and support staff.

“Broken Bow has historically been a regional hub for central Nebraska,” noted Jerry Adams, Co-President of the Custer Campus Board of Directors. “Therefore, the vision of Custer Campus was to develop a Judicial Facility that would serve the needs of Custer County and all of Central Nebraska for years to come,” he added.
