



### **High court suspends Omaha lawyer's license for 45 days**

LINCOLN — An Omaha attorney was suspended for 45 days by the Nebraska Supreme Court on Friday for failing to communicate and properly represent a man appealing a first-degree murder conviction.

The court also ordered two years of supervised probation for Gregory Pivovar, who has been practicing law since 1979.

The court's disciplinary ruling on Friday said Pivovar missed a deadline to file an appeal of Danny Robinson's conviction, then waited eight months to inform him.

While the appeal was later allowed, the ruling said that was not due to actions by the attorney. The supervision will include a monthly report demonstrating that Pivovar is communicating with clients. — **Paul Hammel**
