



# STATE OF NEBRASKA



## Proclamation

WHEREAS, The Office of Dispute Resolution (ODR) of the State of Nebraska, created by statute in 1991 as part of the Administrative Office of the Nebraska Supreme Court, is celebrating almost two decades of mediation in our state; and

WHEREAS, Mediation is a constructive and empowering process which offers the opportunity to address the needs of all Nebraska citizens to resolve disputes in a cooperative and less adversarial way. These cooperative approaches especially help our youngest citizens - children - who are sadly and unfortunately caught in the middle of parental divorce or custody disputes or suffer child abuse and neglect and domestic relations conflicts. Mediators offer an experienced, knowledgeable mediation process to address their needs and interests in a safe, child-centered, and timely way; and

WHEREAS, The six ODR-approved non-profit regional community mediation centers identified below provide "best practice" approaches to parenting mediation, child welfare mediation, facilitation of prehearing and family group conferencing for children and families, as well as access to other dispute resolution services to address disputes in court and in the community:

- Central Mediation Center, Kearney;
- Concord Center, Omaha;
- The Mediation Center, Lincoln;
- Mediation West, Scottsbluff;
- Nebraska Justice Center, Fremont; and
- The Resolution Center, Beatrice; and

WHEREAS, The mediation centers, in cooperation with the Office of Dispute Resolution, have handled over 25,000 cases since 1992 involving families and children, businesses, schools, government and policy makers, neighborhoods and organizations; and

WHEREAS, Professionally trained and experienced center-affiliated mediators have provided nearly 68,000 hours of service to more than 80,000 citizens of Nebraska, all of whom received assistance regardless of their ability to pay; and

WHEREAS, Mediation and other dispute resolution processes are continuing to grow in use and availability, including services such as: Douglas County District Court's Mediation and Conciliation Office, private and independent mediators, Nebraska Mediation Association, Werner Institute for Negotiation and Dispute Resolution, Through the Eyes of the Child initiative to offer pre-hearing facilitated child welfare protective custody conferences in urban and rural courts, and court-referred parenting mediation; and

WHEREAS, In these turbulent times of interpersonal and world conflict, the Office of Dispute Resolution, the ODR-member centers, court-based mediation programs and independent mediators all strive to help Nebraskans to resolve their differences by providing these services.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Dave Heineman, Governor of the State of Nebraska, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM the month of March 2010, as

### MEDIATION MONTH

in Nebraska, and I do hereby urge all citizens to join with me in actively supporting mediation as a means to peaceful resolution of disputes.
