Pursuant to the authority vested in the Chief Justice of the Nebraska Supreme Court under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-2221 and Neb. Const. art. V, § 1, the following order of judicial branch closure for the day of December 24, 2015, is required for the following reasons:

WHEREAS, on Friday, December 11, 2015, the President of the United States issued an Executive Order closing all executive branch departments and agencies of the Federal government and excusing their employees from duty for the last half of the scheduled workday on Thursday, December 24, 2015; and

WHEREAS, on Monday, December 14, 2015, the Governor of the State of Nebraska likewise designated the afternoon of Thursday, December 24, 2015, to be a paid holiday for state offices under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 84-1001.

Being duly advised in the premises, legal complications associated with the designation of partial judicial days as holidays make it necessary to designate that the full work day of Thursday, December 24, 2015, as a court holiday for purposes of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-2221.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, pursuant to my authority under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-2221 and Neb. Const. art. V, § 1 that the offices of the Nebraska courts and probation system may be closed on Thursday, December 24, 2015, as a court holiday.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that for purposes of time computation under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-2221, Thursday, December 24, 2015, is hereby designated as a nonjudicial day for purposes of any necessary filings in the Nebraska court system.
